Priorities for North Kildonan

Infrastructure

- ☑ Continue to increase year-over-year **investments** in our built infrastructure, especially **our roads**
- ☑ Push to **extend Chief Peguis Trail** from Main Street to Route 90 to move regional traffic off local roads and create economic development opportunities
- ☑ Implement the **Kilcona Park (Harbourview) redevelopment plan**
- ☑ Ensure our parks and playgrounds continue to get needed upgrades and improvements
- ☑ Complete upgrades to the North End sewage treatment plant to **improve water quality** in the Red River and Lake Winnipeg



A Clean & Green City

- ☑ Increase the number of roadside and park garbage/recycling bins and provide more frequent pick-ups to **eliminate overflowing bins**
- ☑ **Refresh Henderson Highway** centre medians
- ☑ Complete an **'urbanization'** of **Henderson Highway** north of Gilmore and **Main Street** north of Red River Blvd. with a centre median, removal of drainage ditches, add land drainage sewers, sidewalks and active transportation
- ☑ Reintroduce Health Canada-approved **dandelion control** products along major corridors and some athletic fields
- ☑ Continue investment in our iconic **tree canopy** so that dying trees in public spaces are replaced

Improved Customer Service

- ☑ Reduce 311 wait times
- ☑ Replace the Leisure Guide (including swimming lesson) registration system with one that **doesn't crash**
- ☑ Migrate to a single portal for City services online – **one login** for as many services as possible such as Transit, libraries, property taxes, water & waste, Leisure Guide, permits, parking, etc.



Public Safety & Policing

- ☑ Better **integrate** existing City community centres, leisure programs and police **with provincially funded** social programs, agencies, and housing
- ☑ Advocate for the province to **re-focus existing Family Services & Housing budgets** on results-driven homelessness reduction, addictions treatment and public-space illegal encampments
- ☑ Implement a **dedicated Transit security force** to improve public and driver safety and crackdown on fare evasion
